MEMORIAL PLAQUES

This past year has been a whirlwind for Sam and Elaine Rhodes. Early in 2011 they learned that a new Veterans Memorial Park was being constructed in Stuart which is just a little bit south of their home in Jensen Beach so they investigated the possibility of having our memorial plaques permanently installed in the park. The Stuart officials said they would welcome a display of our plaques. The park honors all who have served in the military forces. Stuart is located on the Atlantic coastline midway between Fort Pierce and West Palm Beach.

There was a set of the black granite plaques in storage so Sam made arrangements for their shipment to the park site. All of this took time of course and Veteran's day was creeping closer. The Park construction was still incomplete so there was frequent anxious communication.

However the park was completed on time and our plaques arrived without a scratch. The plaques are on display but on a temporary base: there just wasn't enough time for the city of Stuart folks to construct a permanent base. A permanent base is under construction now.

Sam and Elaine contacted Museum Association members who live close enough to drive to Stuart advising the Veteran's Day ceremony and some made the journey. Pictured in the photograph, from the left to the right are crew members Leo Hopkins, Sam Rhodes, Walter Jordan and Arnold Bardill.

Dedication of the park was a major event. It began with a parade of sixty nine units consisting of veterans organizations, marching bands, civic groups, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Brownies and, of course, elected officials. At hand to greet the folks were: Joe Negron, Senator; Jeffrey A. Krauskopf, Mayor; Gayle Harrell and William Snyder, State Representatives; and Ruth Pietruszewski, Marin County Tax Collector.

Sam played a dual role during the Veterans Day ceremony. He presided over the plaques dedication and also spoke about World War 2. Sam was one of the original five Directors in 1988 *and is the only one left!* Still on the Board, serving diligently and not about to retire.

They are at peace with our shipmates who have gone before.


